Play some fun music and encourage your child to dance. Press "pause" occasionally and encourage your child to freeze whenever the song pauses. Then say an animal (or pull an animal picture, name, or toy from a hat). Resume the music and dance/move like that animal. Repeat with other animals.

Bunny Hide, Farmer Seek

Bunnies and farmers aren't always the best of friends, so we try to keep them apart! Let your little bunny hide around the house while you (the farmer) count to ten. Tell your little bunny "The farmer is headed to the garden!" as you start to look for them. Once you've found your bunny, the game restarts!

Grow a Garden

Using your imagination, you and your fruit and veggie-loving gardener will plant and pick a garden! Grab supplies from around the house (beads, popsicle sticks/chopsticks, spoons, etc.) and pretend to plant your garden. After pantomiming and role playing, ask your little gardener what they experienced. Was it more work than they thought it would be? Why did they choose the plants that they did? How did you take care of your plants?

READ & WRITE!

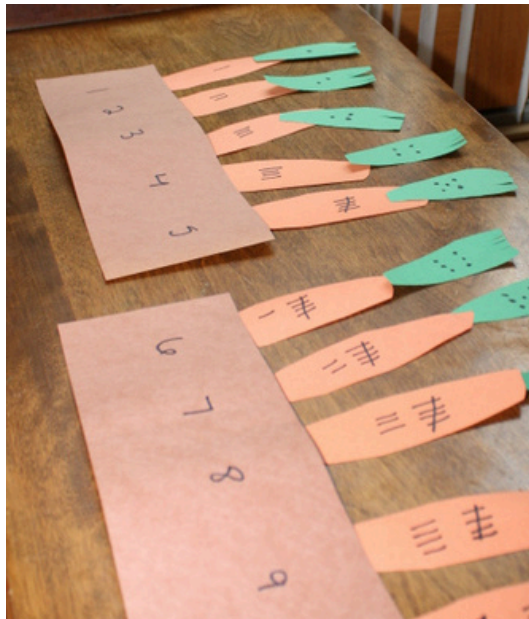
Help your little scholars with their literacy skills.

Feed the Bunny

Have your child "feed the bunny" letters, pictures of items that begin with a certain letter or sound, and for our older learners, words or spelling of words in order (for ex: putting in C first then A then T when prompted to spell CAT). Plant Experiment

What you'll need: 3 small plastic cups; 3 small plastic lids; Soil; Sand; Rocks; Seedlings; Water

Carrot Math

Check out this cool Carrot Number Matching Activity from "3 Dinosaurs!" Take a brown piece of construction paper and cut it in half vertically. Write numbers 1-5 on one and 1-5 on the other horizontally in order. Next cut multiple carrot shapes from orange construction paper and put random tally markers on them (1-10). Then cut green carrot tops out of green construction paper and put random dots on them (1-10). Have your child "plant" the matching carrots and tops to the correct number as pictured to the left.
